WELCOME to LISBON

Legend has it that Ulysses founded the city, although history documents the Phoenicians. Its early years were spent as a constant battleground between Phoenicians, Greeks and Carthaginians until 205 BC when the Romans began their two-century reign. In 1497, Vasco da Gama made his famous discovery of the sea route to India and the wealth from these expeditions transformed Lisbon into a wealthy empire. In 1994, Lisbon returned to the limelight as European City of Culture and reflects a revitalized and vibrant urban life.

EAT LIKE A LOCAL

BACALHAU

Every region has its bacalhau and in Lisbon ask for the Bacalhau à Brás, which is flaked cod with scrambled eggs, potatoes, parsley, and black olives.

AMEIJOAS À BULHÃO PATO

Named in honor of Portuguese writer Raimundo António de Bulhão Pato, the dish features clams served in a pot and mixed with garlic, olive oil, white wine and lemon juice. Remember to dip your bread!

PASTEL DE NATA

There are many delicious pastries throughout Portugal, but in Lisbon, this Portuguese custard tart has egg yolks, milk and sugar and are a delicious snack with espresso.

SHOP LIKE A LOCAL

CORK

Portugal produces at least half of the world's cork, so look for umbrellas, handbags, cutting boards and kitchenware made from the recyclable material. It's durable and lightweight!

AZULEJO TILES

These intricately painted glazed ceramic tiles have been a hallmark of Portugal since the 14th century and can still be seen throughout its major cities today.

GINJINHA

A famous Portuguese cherry liqueur sold all over Lisbon. The young and old drink it and the bottles are very colorful. You can even see the sour cherries floating inside the glass.

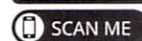

MONSTERRATE PALACE

Tour Code: LSH4

Experience Sintra's UNESCO World Heritage site, the enchanting Monserrate Palace and gardens. Built in the 18th century, it boasts a blend of architectural styles amidst exotic flora. Indulge in Sintra's traditional pastries and explore the romantic town center. Enjoy mineral water, coffee, tea, or juice during your visit.

FATIMA, RELIGIOUS SIGHTS

Explore the famous village of Fatima at your own pace. Legend has it that during a time of war, three young shepherds received the Blessed Virgin's call to peace (Fatima) in the Cova da Iria on May 13, 1917, and five times thereafter on the 13th day of each subsequent month. This and other legends are yours to discover as you enjoy approximately two hours in this revered town to explore at your leisure.

EXPLORE LIKE A LOCAL

CASTLE OF ST. GEORG A

This statue of Christopher Columbus is the perfect place for a This structure stands on the site of a fortification used by the Visigoths in the 5th century. The castle walls enclose the ruins of a Muslim palace that was the residence of the kings of Portugal until the 16th century. Inside the main gate are terraces offering panoramic views of Lisbon.

CALOUSTE GULBLENKIAN MUSEUM B

This museum houses treasures collected by the Armenian oil magnate including paintings by Rembrandt and Rubens, Chinese porcelain, Persian carpets and a large selection of Greek and Roman coins.

BELEM TOWER C

This structure was commissioned by Manuel I and was built as a fortress in the middle of the Tagus in 1515-21. The exterior is beautifully designed and decorated with rope carved in stone, Moorish-style watchtowers and distinctive battlements in the shape of shields.

MONASTERIO DOS JERONIMOS D

Built by Manuel I in 1501, this structure was primarily financed by what was known as "pepper money" which were profits made from the spice trade. It is one of Lisbon's great landmarks.

25TH APRIL BRIDGE E

This suspension bridge is the third largest of its kind in the world and was built in the 1960's.

MONUMENT TO THE DISCOVERIES F

Built in the 1960's, it was constructed to mark the 500th anniversary of the death of Henry the Navigator and was commissioned by the Salazar regime.

MUSEU NACIONAL DOS COCHES G

In 1905, this former riding school was transformed into a museum and contains a collection of the finest coaches in Europe from the 16th through the 19th centuries.
